1. Apologies of Absence

Cllr Leo Hammond invited to speak – conversation held on speeding, the number of road deaths not caused by speeding but by driver errors. The use of ANPR cameras to catch speeders and the work of the PCC offering funding towards a camera, the cameras are going out in batches of 10 so as not to overload the police sending out warning letters. The camera also picks up motorbikes which was a concern to councillors.

Conversation on the sharing of cameras with other villages, re offenders reduced, camera also picks up vehicles with no MOT or road tax.

Other items discussed included, Speed watch Vans, Free dashcams, operation SNAP.

Cllr Robinson expressed an interest in the village hall purchasing a camera and was advised it needs to be run by the PC and how that works.

Mobile home – is still parked in taxi parking place, marked out but no legal signs to say that it can not be parked there.

Issue around school time parking to be looked into and PCSO Bainton to do some visits at school time.

Headstone mentioned at last meeting was agreed.

Village Footpaths – still in poor state Cllr Christon-Whyte chasing.
